Micromessaging To Reach and Teach Every Program Introduction

The National Alliance for Partnership in Equity (NAPE) and the Community College of Baltimore County (CCBC) have partnered to improve the participation, completion and performance of women and other under-represented students in selected science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) core courses and programs of study. The Educators Equity in STEM Academy (EE-STEM Academy) will deliver a high-quality, rigorous professional development program for current secondary school and community college educators.

The EE-STEM Academy will offer to its participants:

- Opportunity to earn a stipend of up to \$1500.
- Food and supplies for the duration of the intensive training sessions.
- Mileage reimbursement for attendance during the intensive training sessions.
- Opportunity to apply for a project mini-grant.
- Opportunities to attend and present at conferences at no cost to you or your employer.
- Professional development credit through CCBC and/or MSDE to support career advancement.

The EE-STEM Academy requests of its participants:

- Attendance at a 5-day intensive training program in reaching and teaching every student through micro-messaging on the CCBC Catonsville Campus August 13—17, 2012
- Completion and implementation of an intervention in your courses based on the training you received.
- Participation in a year-long Professional Learning Community with monthly face-to-face meetings, virtual meetings, and activities for you to try in your classrooms.
- Attendance at a one-day follow-up meeting in August 2013.
- Involvement in a peer mentoring relationship with at least one colleague not in EE-STEM.
- Participation in required NSF evaluation processes including surveys, focus groups, interviews, etc.
