American Families Plan: Education

Add at least four years of free education.

- o Provide universal, quality-preschool to all three- and four- year-olds.
- o Provide Americans, including DREAMers, two years of free community college.
- o Invest in making college more affordable for low- and middle-income students, including students at Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs), Tribal Colleges and Universities (TCUs), and Hispanic-serving institutions, Asian American and Native American Pacific Islander-serving institutions, and other minority-serving institutions (MSIs) by providing two years of subsidized tuition and expand programs in high-demand fields.
- Provide up to \$1,400 in additional assistance to low-income students by increasing the Pell Grant award.
- Increase college retention and completion rates.

Invest in educator leadership.

- Invest \$2 billion to support programs that leverage teachers as leaders, such as high-quality mentorship programs for new teachers and teachers of color.
- Leverage teachers as leaders within school buildings and compensate them for this work, recognizing the expertise of veteran educators, and their value in supporting the next generation of great teachers.



American Families Plan: Education



• Address teacher shortages, improve teacher preparation, and strengthen pipelines for teachers of color.

- Double scholarships for future teachers from \$4,000 to \$8,000 per year while earning their degree, strengthening the program, and expanding it to early childhood educators.
- Invest \$2.8 billion in Grow Your Own programs and year-long, paid teacher residency programs,
- Target \$400 million for teacher preparation at HBCUs, TCUs, and MSIs
- Target \$900 million for the development of special education teachers.

Help current teachers earn in-demand credentials.

- o Invest \$1.6 billion for 100,000 public school educators in schools with a significant portion of low-income students or significant teacher shortages who have at least two years of experience to obtain additional certifications in high-demand areas like special education, bilingual education, and certifications.
- All funds will be available immediately, flowing through the states, and available until expended.



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American Families Plan: Children and Families

- Provide direct support to children and families.
 - o Low- and middle-income families spend no more than 7% of their income on child-care
 - Savings of \$14,800 per year on childcare expenses.
 - o Access to high-quality child-care.
 - o Create a national comprehensive paid family and medical leave program.
 - o Provide critical nutrition assistance to families who need it.
 - Expand access to healthy meals for students –reducing childhood hunger.



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American Families Plan: Childcare

• Supporting child-care providers and workers by:

- Providing developmentally appropriate curriculum,
- Small class sizes
- Culturally and linguistically responsive environments that are inclusive of children with disabilities.
- A \$15 minimum wage for early childhood staff
- Those kindergarten teachers with similar qualifications receive comparable compensation and benefits.
- Invest in maternal health and support families of veterans receiving health care services allowing one million parents, primarily mothers, enter the workforce.
- Bolster inclusive and equitable economic growth.



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American Families Plan: Medical Leave & Nutrition

- Create a national comprehensive paid family and medical leave program.
 - Twelve weeks of paid parental, family, and personal illness/safe leave
 - Workers get three days of bereavement leave per year starting in year one.
 - o Provide workers up to \$4,000 a month, with a minimum of two-thirds of average weekly wages replaced, rising to 80 percent for the lowest wage workers.

Nutrition

- o Expand summer EBT to all eligible children nationwide.
- Expand school meal programs for children in the highest poverty districts.
- o Launch foods incentive to improve the nutrition standards of school meals.
- Facilitate re-entry for formerly incarcerated individuals through SNAP eligibility many of whom are parents of young children.



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American Families Plan: Unemployment and Taxes

• Extend tax cuts for families with children and American workers.

- Extend the Child Tax Credit
- o Extend the Earned Income Tax Credit
- Extend the Child and Dependent Care Tax Credit
- o Extend expanded health insurance tax credit.

Tax Cuts for America's Families and Workers

- Extend Affordable Care Act premiums tax credits.
- Lower prescription drug costs by letting Medicare negotiate prices.
- Reduce insurance premiums & deductibles for those who buy coverage.
- Create a public option for people to enroll in Medicare at age 60.
- o Close the Medicaid coverage gap to allow health insurance.
- Extend the Child Tax Credit increases through 2025.
- Make the Child Tax Credit permanently fully refundable Permanently increase tax credits to support families with childcare needs.
- Make the Earned Income Tax Credit for childless workers permanent.
- o Give IRS the authority to regulate paid tax preparers.

Unemployment Insurance Reform

Adjust the length and amount of UI benefits unemployed workers receive depending on economic conditions.

Tax Reform

Increase the top tax rate on the wealthiest Americans to 39.6 percent.
