Election Day: November 3

Why should you vote?

Voting is the one of the most powerful ways to make your voice heard in our democracy, but in 2016, only 61.4% of the voting age population in the United States reported voting.

Modern technology has improved access to information on candidates and made it easier to register to vote in many areas, and it is vital to be aware of how you can participate in the 2020 election.

Minnesota's absentee and mail-in voting procedures

Permanent absentee / mail-in voting procedures:

- No excuse required to request an absentee ballot

2020 state absentee / mail-in voting status:

- Coronavirus updates: Absentee/mail-in ballot postmark deadline for the general election was extended to November 3, 2020.



Deadlines to know for voting in Minnesota

Voter registration deadline:

October 13, 2020

Twenty-one days before an election.

Same-day registration is permitted on Election Day

Absentee / Mail-In voting ballot deadlines:

Request must be received by

November 2, 2020

Day before the election

Ballot submission deadline:

By mail: Received by November 3, 2020 (Election Day).

In person: Received by 3:00 pm on Election Day.
