## Career and Technical Education in Virginia

Secondary CTE is delivered through 132 school divisions, including 22 Governor's STEM Academies and 8 Governor's Health Science Academies, with dual enrollment options offered by 105 school divisions. Postsecondary CTE is delivered through the state's community college system.<sup>1</sup>



## Career Cluster Enrollment (FY 2016)

Seven of the 16 career clusters in CTE lead to high-skill, high-wage, and high-demand STEM-related careers (Agriculture, Architecture, Health, Information Technology, Manufacturing, STEM, and Transportation, Distribution, and Logistics) and contain programs that prepare students for nontraditional careers.<sup>2</sup>
